Monument for de victims of de train disaster near Harmelen, revealed on 8 januari 2012, 50 years after the disaster. De design consists of two hard stone slabs standing upright with an angle between them, which have the names of the 93 victims written on them. Between the slabs, de location of the disaster can be seen.
